Prescription Requests

Please note we do not do same day prescriptions.

Prescriptions take at least 48 hours to process.

Boots Pharmacy will no longer be ordering medication for patients.

The Pharmacy requires 1 week from order to collection.

Flu Information

Patients in the 50-64 Patients in the 50-64 year old age group will **not** be vaccinated until

November and December, providing there is sufficient vaccine, and no appointments will be offered for this age group until then.

This is to ensure that those who are most at risk are vaccinated first.

If you are 50-64 and you are in one of the other groups which is eligible for the flu vaccination, for example you have a health condition which puts you at risk from the flu, you will be invited earlier.

Linking Leeds

Linking Leeds is a city-wide social prescribing service for anyone aged 16+ and registered to a GP surgery in Leeds.

Linking Leeds is currently offering telephone appointments to link patients with services and activities within the community to improve and maintain health and wellbeing.

Extended Access Service at Seacroft Hospital

A virtual clinical pharmacist service –

This is a telephone appointment for patients who need to speak to a pharmacist regarding a medication issue but don't need to come to surgery. The pharmacists are able to prescribe and organise prescriptions electronically.

<u>A virtual musculoskeletal (MSK) service –</u>

This is a telephone appointment for patients who need to speak to an advanced physiotherapist regarding muscle and joint problems. They will issue advice and where appropriate arrange a follow up.

For either of the above please speak to the reception team for further information on how to book one of these appointments.

All the above are now offered 7 days a week including bank holidays.

Weekend Appointments

There are now weekend Healthcare Assistant appointments for urgent bloods.

This increased availability is an extension of the services offered by your practice and is provided by a range of local clinicians including GPs, Nurses and Health Care Assistants.

Please note this is not a walk-in service - you still need to make an appointment via your own GP practice.

Extended Access appointments are for routine general practice issues and not for urgent care.

If your practice is closed and you are unwell, please call NHS 111.

Cervical Screening

Cervical screening is one of the best ways to protect yourself from cervical cancer.

Cervical screening checks the health of your cervix. **It's not a test for cancer**, it's a test to help prevent cancer.

How cervical screening helps prevent cancer

Cervical screening may check for:

abnormal cell changes in your cervix – left untreated, this could turn into cancer

HPV – some types of HPV can lead to cell changes in your cervix and cancer.

What is HPV?

Human papillomavirus (HPV) is the name for a very common group of viruses.

You can get it from any kind of skin-to-skin contact of the genital area, not just from penetrative sex. Most people will get some type of HPV during their lives. Nearly all cervical cancers are caused by infection with certain types of HPV.

Baby Clinic is no longer a walk-in clinic.

The Baby Clinic runs Tuesday 11am-12pm and Friday 10am 12pm.
